 Prof Charlotte Humphreys' presentation on equality and diversity issues was of particular interest in relation to HPC and its Fitness to Practice work

Key messages

1. Previous research has shown that overseas qualified doctors (OQD) proportionately represented in GMC Fitness to practice processes overall, but are over-represented in the later stages of that process and more OQDs referred by public bodies to GMC.

2. Prof Humphreys and colleagues are now undertaking three new projects with the GMC

- a. Clarify factors associated with the progression of cases in the GMC's fitness to practice processes (05/06)
- **b.** Measure organisational attitudes to diversity
- c. Undertake a literature review of issues

Other relevant questions for HPC...

What are the precursors of medical performance problems? What are the challenges encountered by ethnic minority doctors. What about other health care professionals in relation to ethnicity and referral?

In addition there were interesting presentations from Melody Rhydderch, Cardiff, on the biopsychosocial factors associated with performance and John Fromson Harvard on a behavioural programme for doctors in the US. (Details upon request)
