Executive summary and recommendations

Introduction

- The application pack circulated to all prospective members in Spring 2009 stated that there was an expectation that Council members demonstrated "high standards of corporate and personal conduct, including impartiality, objectivity and integrity in the implementation of the role and responsibilities". To that end, appointments were offered on the understanding that members subscribed to the Council's Code of Conduct.
- 2. Whilst members were provided with copies of the Code of Conduct on their appointment, they were not required to formally subscribe to the Code.
- 3. At the meeting of Council in July 2010, the suggestion was made that members reaffirm their commitment to the Code on an annual basis. In order to provide a mechanism to do this, a declaration has been drafted and is appended to this paper at appendix A.

4. Appendix A shows the proposed declaration form. Members are asked to agree the content of the declaration form.
