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## 1 Management commentary

## **Approval process**

The Department has spent the last couple of months attending the remaining approval visits scheduled in the 2013–14 academic year. In April and May, 23 visits took place involving 54 programmes. 12 visits involving 20 programmes are scheduled for June and July 2014. In total, 78 visits across 172 programmes were arranged from September 2013 - August 2014. This is a significant increase (73%) on the previous academic year, when 45 visits were held. The majority of the visits are to social worker programmes and AMHP programmes.

Once the schedule of visits for 2013-14 is complete, the Department will review the second year of visits to social worker programmes and the first year of visits to AMHP programmes. A review of supplementary and independent prescribing programmes approved in 2013-14 is also underway. The findings of all three reviews will be brought to the Education and Training Committee later this year.

The Department has continued to schedule approval visits in the 2014–15 academic year. In total, 39 visits across 71 programmes have been arranged from September 2014 - August 2015. The majority of these visits are to social worker and AMHP programmes.

## Annual monitoring process

The Department has now completed the majority of the annual monitoring process in the 2013–14 academic year. The final two assessment days took place in May. All remaining submissions will now be considered via postal assessment. In total, seven assessment days were held for the 2013-14 academic year. This is the same number as the previous academic year. To date, all programmes have continue to meet the standards and no visits have been recommended.

Once the activities for 2013-14 are complete, the Department will review the integration of the practitioner psychologist and hearing aid dispenser programmes into the annual monitoring process, as in previous years.

## Major change process

The Department considered 30 new major change notifications, covering 42 programmes in April and May. The Education and Training Panel considered 7 programmes which had engaged with the major change process on 5 June 2014 and decided that each of these programmes continued to meet our standards of education and training and an approval visit was not required.

## **Concerns process**

The Department received no new concerns in April and May. There are currently no outstanding concerns.

## Service user and carer involvement in education and training

The Department has continued to prepare for the introduction of the new standard of education and training (SET 3.17) from September 2014. Activities have included amending the suggested agenda for future approval visits to include a meeting with service users and carers; circulating a briefing document to existing visitors; arranging training sessions for the executive and visitors; updating the website; advertising the six autumn seminars and communicating our expectations and guidance to education providers and key stakeholders via the recent Education Update newsletter.

## Lay visitors

103 applications were received for the lay visitor role and 41 interviews took place w/c 2 and 9 June. Offers have been made to successful applicants and training will take place on 8 and 9 July 2014. Lay visitors will be included on all visit panels as of September 2014.

## Seminars

Dates and locations have now been confirmed for the eight education seminars planned for autumn/winter 2014-15, which can be found in the table below. The seminars will follow a similar format to last year.

## Major project - Education systems build

The Department continues to drive forward the major project, with the intention that a new system and internal processes will be in place in early 2015.

The chosen approach continues to see the suppliers deliver the constituent components of the system across a series of nine cycles of building, deployment, testing and feedback. Since the build commenced in November 2013, the first five cycles have been completed, with the sixth due to complete at the end of July 2014.

## Employees

Following the resignation and departure of two Education Officers (Louise Devlin and Ruth Wood) in June 2014, the total number of employees is currently 16. The budgeted headcount for the Department is 19. Recruitment plans are currently being finalised for the replacement of one Education Officer.
