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1 Management commentary

Approval process

The Department has continued to schedule approval visits in the 2014-15 academic year. In total, 54 visits across 92 programmes have been arranged from September 2014 - August 2015. The majority of visits are to social worker and AMHP programmes (60%), with a significant proportion (29%) to new paramedic programmes. In December 2014 and January 2015, 9 visits took place involving 16 programmes. January to March 2015 is particularly busy, with 24 visits taking place. The overall schedule is virtually finalised as the required six months' notice of visits means that we can only schedule visits in late August 2015.

The Department has recently completed three internal reviews of our quality assurance activities in the last academic year, namely the reviews of the second year of visits to social worker programmes, the first year of visits to AMHP programmes and the review of new supplementary and independent prescribing provision. These review reports have been published on-line and promoted through social media and Education Update in January 2015. They will also be brought to the March 2015 meeting of the Education and Training Committee (ETC).

Annual monitoring process

The Department has spent the past few months processing annual monitoring submissions in the 2014–15 academic year. In December 2014, 12 audit submissions were received. The majority of submissions are expected between January and April 2015. The first two assessment days will be held later this month, with a further seven assessment days scheduled between April and August 2015. As a consequence, it is envisaged that the majority of visitors' reports will be considered by Education and Training Panels in March, May, June and August 2015.

Major change process

The Department considered 23 new major change notifications, covering 38 programmes in December 2014. The Education and Training Panel considered four programmes which had recently engaged with the major change process on 4 December 2014. The Panel decided that each of these programmes continued to meet our standards of education and training.

Concerns process

The Department received one new concern in January 2015. It was necessary to request further documentation from the complainant before we could decide whether the concern meets our criteria for further investigation. A concern originally received in August 2014 remains on hold as a related allegation about a registrant is being investigated by the Fitness to Practice department.

Website

The revised layout to the education webpages has been slightly delayed, with a rollout planned for March 2015.

Partners

The following 14 new visitors were recruited in December and will be trained in February 2015. 3 paramedics; 1 art therapist; 2 drama therapists; 2 occupational therapists; 4 social workers, 1 speech and language therapist and 1 chiropodist with POM.

Approximately 45 visitors attended one day refresher training sessions in December and January. A final refresher training session will be delivered in February for approximately 27 visitors. This will mean that approximately 120 visitors have attended refresher sessions in 2014-15.

Seminars

The Department is currently coordinating participant feedback from the eight seminars delivered from October – December 2014.

Publications

The Department is finalising analysis for the Education annual report 2014 (based on the 2013-14 academic year). The report will incorporate parts of the reviews into the second year of visits to social worker programmes, the first year of visits to AMHP programmes and the review of new independent prescribing provision. The report is due to be considered by ETC in March 2015 with publication anticipated in May 2015.

Liaison with stakeholders

The eighteenth issue of Education Update was distributed to stakeholders' on 14 January and made available on the HCPC website at: <u>http://www.hcpc-uk.org/education/update/</u>. The format and style of the newsletter was revised significantly with assistance from the Communications department to ensure readability and relevance for our key stakeholders.

Major project - Education systems build

In December 2014, the project moved into the substantial period of user acceptance testing. The first two cycles in December and January went well and one further cycle continues this month. Initial data migration has also taken place. User system training is planned for February 2015 with the initial go live in March 2015. There are currently five members of staff working full time on the project. The final phase of the project (integrations with other HCPC systems) will take place in the 2015-16 financial year with a proposed go live in autumn 2015.

Employees

The total number of employees remains at seventeen, including two formally seconded to the major project.
