1 Management commentary

Approval process

The visit workload from the 2015-16 academic year is nearly complete, with two more visits planned in July & August 2016. The post visit work is progressing well with the majority of cases scheduled for closure ahead of the next academic year. In total, there were 44 visits scheduled within the 2015-16 academic year, which is 30% less than the previous academic year.

There are 18 visits scheduled within the next academic year, 2016-17. At this stage, the profession profile is much more mixed than in previous years, with less of a skew towards paramedic and social worker programmes. Given the six month notice period that is required, we are only scheduling visits from January 2017 now.

Annual monitoring process

The workload in the 2015-16 academic year continues to progress well. We held the final of nine assessment days in June 2016 and work is now focused on post assessment day additional documentation requests and a few late submissions which will be considered by post. We have seen an increase (21%) in additional documentation requests in the 2015-16 academic year with most of these related to the assessment of the new standard around service user and carer involvement.

Major change process

The workload in the 2015-16 academic year continues to progress well. We are continuing to receive a significantly higher number of notifications compared to the last academic year (2014-15). We have received 10% more notifications in April and May 2016 compared to the same two months last year. The average time taken to consider a complete case remains under three months. We have received a few notifications of changes to supplementary/independent prescribing programmes to accommodate the recent change in medicines legislation for dietitians and therapeutic radiographers.

Concerns process

The Department received one new concern in May 2016. Two concerns were closed in June 2016; one at the initial enquiry stage and one following consideration at Education and Training Committee. As of 30 June 2016, there were no active concerns.

Partners

In May & June 2016, we successfully recruited 12 new visitors (a mix of orthoptist, social work, AMHP and lay) which has ensured sufficient numbers are maintained. A two day introductory training session is planned for October 2016.

Education Update

Issue 23 was published in June 2016. We have increased the newsletter from three to four times a year to provide education providers and stakeholders with relevant information in a timelier manner. It is currently circulated to approximately 1800 contacts.

The final phase of the Education systems build major project is on-going. Integration work with NetRegulate and the website is progressing, with project closure anticipated in late summer 2016.

Hollie Latham (Education Officer) has recently moved to the Policy and Standards Department and Liz Johnson (PA) has recently started her maternity leave. Recruitment is ongoing for a replacement Education Officer and temporary PA. Paula Lescott (Head of Education Systems and Quality) is due to return from her maternity leave in late July 2016.
